A rollicking exploration of the history and future of our favorite foods

When we humans love foods, we love them a lot. In fact, we have often eaten them into extinction, whether it is the megafauna of the Paleolithic world or the passenger pigeon of the last century. In *Lost Feast*, food expert Lenore Newman sets out to look at the history of the foods we have loved to death and what that means for the culinary paths we choose for the future. Whether it's chasing down the luscious butter of local Icelandic cattle or looking at the impacts of modern industrialized agriculture on the range of food varieties we can put in our shopping carts, Newman's bright, intelligent gaze finds insight and humor at every turn.

Bracketing the chapters that look at the history of our relationship to specific foods, Lenore enlists her ecologist friend and fellow cook, Dan, in a series of "extinction dinners" designed to recreate meals of the past or to illustrate how we might be eating in the future. Part culinary romp, part environmental wake-up call, *Lost Feast* makes a critical contribution to our understanding of food security today. You will never look at what's on your plate in quite the same way again.

LENORE NEWMAN is the Canada Research Chair in Food Security and Environment at the University of the Fraser Valley. She is the author of the acclaimed *Speaking in Cod Tongues: A Canadian Culinary Journey.* She divides her time between Vancouver and Roberts Creek, British Columbia.







In 2008–09, she served as the first senior advisor on water to the 63rd president of the UN General Assembly and was a leader in the campaign to have water recognized as a human right by the UN. In 2005, she won the prestigious Right Livelihood Award, the "alternative Nobel." She lives in Ottawa, Ontario.

Heart, determination, and triumph

This is the story of a boy who fell in love with wrestling before he was able to walk. Born with achondroplasia, a condition that causes disproportionate dwarfism, Dylan Postl had endured multiple surgeries by the age of 12. And yet, he held on to the dream that he would one day become a professional wrestler. Ignoring the naysayers and against doctors' recommendations, Postl began training in his teens, and he soon began appearing on local independent shows. Before he turned 20, he was signed by WWE to play the role of Irish grappler Finlay's feisty sidekick, Hornswoggle, and remained a fixture in the company for a full decade.

While most of Postl's adult life has been spent in the wild world of the wrestling industry, his is more than a story of a little person's journey through a world of giants; it's a memoir of elation and anguish, triumph and disappointment, and of how an endlessly positive outlook combined with the unwavering support of family and friends helped a long shot become a success in his industry and a loving, responsible father.

DYLAN POSTL is a promoter and wrestler who spent a decade working for WWE. He currently wrestles for a number of independent promotions worldwide and runs the Wisconsin-based company All-Star Championship Wrestling. He lives in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. **ROSS OWEN WILLIAMS** is a business consultant, actor, and writer whose work includes multi-award-winning feature film *Winter Ridge* and books *The Hardcore Truth: The Bob Holly Story* and *Self Help: Life Lessons from the Bizarre Wrestling Career of Al Snow.* Ross lives in Somerset, England.






At 14, Rocky Johnson left home to seek fortune and make professional wrestling his career. An incredibly agile and talented wrestler for a man his size, he soon became a featured main-eventer in every territory he worked — from Los Angeles to New York, and all points in between. He also appeared in wrestling arenas worldwide, including in Canada, Japan, Saudi Arabia, Samoa, and Puerto Rico.

In *Soulman*, Johnson not only explores his career accomplishments, but also reflects upon what his achievements, as a direct descendant of slaves, mean historically and for Black culture. In the South, he shattered racial barriers when he became the first African-American to win the Southern, Georgia, and Florida heavyweight titles, and in 1983, he teamed with Tony Atlas to become the first all-Black WWWF tag team champions. Rocky sees his greatest accomplishment, however, in his son Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson, whom he trained to be a wrestler in 1995 and who is now the highest-paid actor in Hollywood and one of the most-recognized names in the world.



THERE'S NO SUCH THING AS A BAD KID

HOW I WENT FROM STEREOTYPE TO PROTOTYPE

THADDEUS BULLARD WITH PAUL GUZZO

An inspiring story from a humanitarian role model and WWE superstar, known to fans as Titus O'Neil

One caring person can change the course of a child's life — Thaddeus Bullard knows that first-hand. Growing up, he was repeatedly confronted with negativity. By the time he was a teenager, he figured that he was the bad kid everyone said he was — until an adult looked him in the eye and said, "There is no such thing as a bad kid." Unfortunately, many children across North America are labeled "bad." They may have short attention spans, unstable home environments, or learning difficulties. Often, these young people are diagnosed with an emotional or behavioral disorder and placed in special classes. They internalize these labels, and the imposed limitations affect their ability to learn, behave, and fit in.

There's No Such Thing as a Bad Kid chronicles Thaddeus's turbulent childhood years as he was helped to shed the label and realize his unique greatness, his value and potential. "Poetry is an act of mischief," Theodore Roethke famously once said, and Chris Banks takes this as his credo in *Midlife Action Figure*.
