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# IT'S ONLY FOREVER

LABYRINTH

Jes Battis

A wild, intimate, and political deep dive into Jim Henson's 1986 classic starring David Bowie and its cast of lovable, gender-defying goblins.

In the 40 years since *Labyrinth*'s release, Jim Henson's cult classic starring a menagerie of goblin puppets, the conversation about it has only grown louder. Fans are still holding viewing parties and masquerade balls, and creating memes inspired by David Bowie's sardonic and sexy goblin king, numerous Etsy crafts, and even a Japanese video game. But what makes the film so enduring, beyond its technical mastery and clever script, is how it presents childhood as something dangerous, heroic, and even queer.

It's Only Forever explores Labyrinth as an '80s time capsule that both reflects and challenges its era, offering its young audience an alternative to conservatism and soulless economics, at a time when U.S. president Ronald Reagan ignored the HIV/AIDS crisis, pushing queerness further into the shadows. As Sarah, played by a teenaged Jennifer Connelly, faces down the king and his destructive whims, she exclaims, "You have no power over me," and in that moment, she is everyone who has ever felt marginalized, who has instead turned to the goblins over social and political toxicity every single time.

From the costuming to the twisting plot, this classic example of 1980s fantasy shows us that the magic and comfort of childhood never need to be discarded as we are forced to enter a world that may very well seek to destroy us. Instead, *Labyrinth* reveals a universal and beautiful truth: that our strength comes from what we have always known ourselves to be — beastly, loving, and wildly joyful.

Jes Battis is a queer autistic writer and teacher, and the author of *The Winter Knight*, the Occult Special Investigator series, and the Parallel Parks series (as Bailey Cunningham). Their work has been shortlisted for a Saskatchewan Book Award and a Sunburst Award, as well as the Ralph Gustafson Poetry Prize. *The Winter Knight* was featured in the Canada Reads 2024 competition and won both an Independent Publisher's Award and an Indie Foreword Award. Battis teaches queer and trans studies, medieval literature, and representations of disability/neurodiversity in pop culture at the University of Regina. They split time between the prairies and the West Coast.



- THE DARK HEART OF CHILDHOOD: Labyrinth, with its goblin king David Bowie and outsized creatures, is a film that spoke directly to misfits, to the children who wished to escape their daily lives and become the person they knew they were inside. For queer and neurodivergent kids in the 1980s, this was nothing short of a miraculous gift. Come for the goblin karaoke, stay for the wild unraveling of gender.
- CALLING ALL POP CULTURE READERS: Film and TV buffs, sci-fi/fantasy fans, '80s kids, David Bowie admirers, puppet lovers, and queer, trans, and neurodivergent viewers who have been deeply impacted by the film this is for you!
- **40TH ANNIVERSARY:** The last feature film directed by Jim Henson, *Labyrinth* has developed a significant internet fan following since the '90s: r/labyrinth has 16K members, and the annual two-day event Labyrinth of Jareth Masquerade Ball, where fans can dress in costumes inspired by the film, has been held in various locations including San Diego, Hollywood, and L.A.
- **UK & INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS:** While *Labyrinth* was a box-office failure in the U.S., it was a hit in the United Kingdom and overseas, grossing \$34 million worldwide. Later, the film would go on to be a success in home video and television broadcasts and is now considered a cult classic.
- ADAPTATIONS FOR DAYS: Labyrinth's popularity is apparent in the many adaptations of the
  project: novelizations, video games, board games, comics, and even a sequel has been in
  development for many years.

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The ECW office is situated on land that was the traditional territory of many nations, including the Wendat, the Anishinaabeg, Haudenosaunee, Chippewa, Métis, and the Mississaugas of the Credit, the latter of whom completed negotiation of a Treaty No. 13 known as the "Toronto Purchase" begun in 1787, negotiated in 1805, and re-negotiated in 2010. It was a sandy oak savannah on a hill rising westward from Heward Creek, one of Toronto's lost ravines. In the 1880s, the land was developed as part of a growing community around St. Matthew's Anglican and other churches. In the 1950s, our neighborhood, now known as East Chinatown, was transformed by people moving into the area, dispossessed by the building of Nathan Phillips Square and subsequent rise in real estate value in Old Chinatown, and immigrants fleeing the Vietnam War. We are grateful to those who cared for the land before us, and we are proud to be working now amidst this mix of cultures.

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
